Municipal Services Update

The overall change year-to-date is -1.73.

The Department of Sanitation cleanliness rating of our streets, known as the "scorecard" rating, was 90 for clean streets and 94.6 for sidewalks for the month of March. We urge everyone to adhere to the Department of Sanitation's residential enforcement routing times of 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. daily.

Please clean in front of your properties and 18 inches into the gutter area of the street. All sweepings must be bagged and disposed of

properly. Thank you for your assistance in helping to keep the District clean.

WATER BILL AMNESTY

The NYC Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is offering a limited one-time amnesty with up to 100% interest forgiveness for all delinquent customers. Additionally, payment plans of up to 10 years are available to make it as easy as possible to pay off your water bill balance.

The program is designed to provide much needed relief to qualified customers struggling to pay their water and wastewater bills due to the pandemic. Amnesty runs through April 30, 2023 and allows you to have your accrued interest reduced or forgiven by paying your principal balance.

You will not be penalized if you are on a payment plan. However, if you do not take advantage of this Amnesty program, you run the risk of having a lien placed on your property, thus leading to the loss of your home. NEW WASTE SETOUT TIMES IN EFFECT

New rules for setting out trash, recycling, and curbside composting went into effect on April 1, 2023. The following is a summary of those rules and how they will impact residences and businesses.

Residential buildings have three options:

- Place trash out after 6:00 p.m. in a container with a secure lid,
- Place trash out after 8:00 p.m. if putting bags directly on the curb,
- If a building has nine or more residential units, the property owner may opt into a 4:00–7:00 a.m. set-out window instead. For more information, visit www.nyc.gov/multiunitsetout.

Businesses that place the waste at the curb for collection have two options, unless waste is collected from a loading dock:

- If using a container with a secure lid, place the waste at the curb 1 hour before closing,
- If putting bags directly on the curb, place waste out after 8:00 p.m. Bundled cardboard may go next to the containers or bags

For both residential properties and businesses, setting out too early could result in fines of \$50 for a first offense, \$100 for a second offense, and \$200 for third and subsequent offenses within a 12-month period.

There is a one-month grace period where warnings will be issued in lieu of tickets. Starting May 1, 2023, tickets will be issued, and the first areas to be checked for enforcement will be those places where warnings were issued.

PUBLIC HEARING AND OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT ON RAT MITIGATION ZONES

New York City has a robust approach to rat control using a variety of approaches depending on conditions. One approach recognized in Local Law 110 (2022) has been to designate areas with high levels of rat activity as "Rat Mitigation Zones," and focus a data-driven, coordinated, multi-agency effort to address rats and the conditions that causes them. Local Law 110 requires the Department to promulgate a rule designating Rat Mitigation Zones using criteria set out in Local Law 110.

On May 4, 2023 at 10 a.m., there will be a public hearing on the proposal to add new Chapter 35 to Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York governing the creation of Rat Mitigation Zones. The hearing will be conducted by video conference accessible via internet or telephone.

NYC SEXUAL HEALTH CLINICS

Sextually transmitted diseases and infections (STDs/STIs) are on the rise in District 8 and New York City as a whole. Despite decades of safe sex campaigns, the current trend of increasing sexually transmitted diseases and even the rise in treatment resistant strains of certain viruses like gonorrhea has led to a greater need for community education.

NYC Sexual Health Clinics (SHC) provide lowcost and no-cost services for anyone age 12 and older, regardless of immigration or insurance status. Parental consent is not needed to access these services, and most services are provided on a walk-in basis with a limited capacity each day.

Services include STI screening, testing, and treatment; HIV testing and treatment initiation for those newly diagnosed; HIV post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) and pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) initiation and counseling; emergency contraception; a range of birth control methods; medication abortion; Mpox testing, treatment, and vaccination; HPV, hep A, hep B, and meningitis vaccination.

There is a sexual health clinic in every borough. Brooklyn's is located at 295 Flatbush Avenue Extension and is open Monday to Friday from 8:30 a.m. to Noon and 1 to 3:30 p.m.; and Tuesday from 5 to 7 p.m. for express testing only.

To speak to a health care provider for telemedicine services related to HIV and other STIs, contraception and medication abortion, call the NYC SHC hotline at 347-396-7959 Monday thru Friday from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. If you think you were exposed to HIV and cannot make it to a clinic, call the NYC PEP hotline at 844-3-PEPNYC (844-373-7692). This hotline is 24 hours.

ADULT CONTINUING EDUCATION AND ESL CLASSES

Adult Continuing Education is a branch of the NYC Dept. of Education that caters educational services to adults over the age of 21. Their classes are free and open to the community regardless of immigration status. English proficiency classes are offered as are GED classes.

Registration is in-person only and takes place weekly at the enrollment hub located at 271 Melrose street in Brooklyn, NY 11206 as well at MS61 located on 400 Empire Blvd., Brooklyn, NY 11225 from 8:00am - 2:00pm M-F and 6:00pm - 9:00pm Tuesday and Wednesdays and Thursdays (ESL).

Having checks, medical documentation, passports, or other identifying information stolen puts New Yorkers at serious risk. It is imperative that the United States Postal Service do everything in its power to ensure that mail, property, and information transported through the USPS is secure.

Residents experiencing mail theft should report the incidents by going to their local NYPD precinct or dialing 911. New Yorkers can also file a report with the Postal Inspection Service by calling the hotline at 1-877-876-2455 or by going to uspis.gov/report so that federal crimes can be investigated and addressed.


OPEN STREETS IN DISTRICT 8
