Working with dozens of art service organizations, the program will distribute one-time \$5,000 grants to more than 3,000 artists to help them sustain their practice and engage the public across the city. # EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT

~~~~

The Emergency Broadband Benefit is an FCC program to help families and households struggling to afford internet service during the COVID-19 pandemic. This new benefit will connect eligible households to jobs, critical healthcare services, virtual classrooms, and so much more.

The Emergency Broadband Benefit will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a onetime discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price.

The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household. A household is eligible if a member of the household meets one of the criteria below:

- Has an income that is at or below 135% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines or participates in certain assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid, or Lifeline;
- Approved to receive benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school breakfast program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision in the 2019-2020 or 2020-2021 school year;
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year;
- Experienced a substantial loss of income due to job loss or furlough since February 29, 2020 and the household had a total income in 2020 at or below \$99,000 for single filers and \$198,000 for joint filers; or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income or COVID-19 program.

Eligible households must both apply for the program and contact a participating provider to select a service plan and there are three ways for eligible households to apply:

• Contact a participating broadband provider directly to learn about their application process. If you are unable to apply through them directly, you will have to apply using option 2 or 3 below, and then contact a participating provider to select an eligible plan. • Go

www.GetEmergencyBroadband.org to apply online and to find participating providers near you. After you apply, you will have to contact a participating provider to select an eligible plan.

After you received a notice that you have qualified for the program, households must contact a participating provider to select an Emergency Broadband Benefit eligible service plan.

MTA MASK FORCE

You are invited to join the MTA on June 17, 2021 as they bring back the MTA Mask Force to subway lines and buses in Brooklyn. Masks are still required on public transit and at stations. You can read more about Mask Force on their website and see photos of the MTA employees and volunteers who have been handing out masks to Transit customers since July 2020.

If this is your first time volunteering, note that there are multiple hub locations and times via the signup link. From the hubs, volunteers fan out on different lines and to different stations, so the closest hub may not be in your district, but you can get materials from the hub and distribute them at subway stations or buses in your district. Each volunteer is given their own KN-95 mask along with gloves, sanitizer, as well as bright yellow Mask Force gear to help customers identify them. Volunteers must be 18 years or older and will work 2.5 hour shifts from ten locations throughout the five boroughs (the locations in Brooklyn will be Atlantic Avenue Barclays Center and Broadway Junction).
