NEWS ABOUT THE SENIOR CITIZEN RENT INCREASE EXEMPTION (SCRIE)

The recently passed New York State budget includes a provision that will increase the SCRIE eligibility income limit from \$29K to \$50K, a much needed increase that will help hundreds of thousands of seniors city-wide. If the groundbreaking increase is approved by the City Council, the change will go into effect as of July 1, 2014.

FREE HEAD AND NECK CANCER SCREENING

Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center is offering free head and neck cancer screenings on Friday, April 25, 2014 from 10 AM to 1 PM at Brooklyn Infusion Center located at 557-1 Atlantic Avenue.

Head and neck cancer can occur in the nasal passages, mouth, throat, voice box, or skin. Warning signs can be frequent nose bleeds, ongoing nasal congestion, persistent sore or growth in mouth or throat, constant ear aches, lasting change in voice, bloody phlegm lasting several days, lump in neck lasting more than two weeks, changes in skin or mole, or problems swallowing.

The screening involves a 10-minute exam by doctors, counseling on quitting smoking if applicable, and nutritional advice on cancer-preventive diets.

Any adult that smokes, drinks, or spends a lot of time in the sun; and adults who notice any of the warning sign of head and neck cancer.
