## **DISTRICT MANAGER'S REPORT**

Did you know that all Webex Virtual meetings organized by Community Board 8 during the Covid Pause are recorded and available on our website and our YouTube Channel? 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## **INDOOR DINING RETURNS!**

After an extended break, indoor dining will return to New York City restaurants on February 12<sup>th</sup>! Restaurants will be able to seat patrons at 25% capacity. Same restrictions and requirements as previously held will be in place again. Patrons will need to remain masked when not eating or drinking, adhere to social distancing, one member of the group must leave contact information, and temperatures will be taken.

Additionally, sports and music arenas will be open to spectators at 10% capacity starting on February 23<sup>rd</sup>. To be eligible to re-open for spectators, venues must be considered large-scale and must hold more than 100,000 souls. While each venue will produce its own safety plan, they must include requirements to adhere to a 10-percent capacity limit, assigned seating for social distancing, temperature checks, negative PCR tests within 72 hours of the event and face coverings among other things.

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## **COVID-19 VACCINATIONS**

Covid-19 vaccines are available to all New Yorkers age 65 and older. Please call (877) 829-4692 (877-VAX-4NYC) and give your zip code for a location and date for your vaccination shot. This service is provided by NYC Health and Hospitals Corporation.

Additionally, pharmacies are also beginning to receive the vaccine for distribution to the public. Walgreens is now offering the Covid-19 vaccine locally and you can search for an appointment directly on their website. You will need to first create a Walgreens account and then search for Covid-19 vaccine and follow prompts.

Residents aged 65+ unable to travel for their vaccine are eligible for free vaccine transportation services to and from City vaccination sites with Curb-powered taxi services.

Call (877) 829-4692 (877-VAX-4NYC) to make an appointment at a City-operated vaccination site. After making an appointment to get vaccinated, participants will be screened and directed to Curb's 24/7 call center to book their trips, Access-a-Ride, or ambulette services as appropriate.

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## **NYC FREE TAX PREP**

If you earned \$68,000 or less in 2020, you can file your taxes for free with the help of an IRS certified VITA/TCE volunteer preparer. Preparers can help you file your taxes safely now and transmit the returns to the IRS when they open the tax season on Friday, February 12, 2021. You can file safely from the comfort of your home or in person.

Services are available in English, Spanish, Arabic, Bengali, Chinese, French, Haitian Creole, Korean, and Russian. Additional languages are available through phone interpretation.

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## **PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTIONS**

It is now easier than ever to apply for property tax exemptions! The City of New York offers property tax exemptions for seniors, veterans, clergy members, people with disabilities, and other select homeowners. These benefits can reduce property taxes by up to 50% and save homeowners thousands of dollars each year.

Income limits for seniors and persons with disabilities (SCHE and DHE) is \$58,399. Additionally, the STAR program is available to homeowners with annual salaries less than \$500,000 (must apply with the state), and Enhanced STAR is available for seniors 65 and older with annual incomes of \$90,550 or less.

Those that serves in the US military during designated periods of conflict, their un-remarried surviving spouses, and Gold Star parents are eligible for tax exemptions. Additionally, active and retired members of the clergy or their un-remarried surviving spouses can receive tax exemptions.

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## **WINTER SERVICES FOR SENIORS**

Seniors living in Bed-Stuy and Crown Heights might be eligible for upcoming services through a "Naturally Occurring Retirement Community" (NORC) set up by Councilman Robert Cornegy. Those 60 years and older who live in the 36<sup>th</sup> Council District can take part in the "NORC," a designation that lets seniors stay in their homes while accessing a host of city-funded services, like healthcare, classes or outings.

The NORC, set up with the help of Brooklyn Neighborhood Services, released its schedule for the winter season, including a series of webinars focused on generational wealth retention,

financial literacy and help accessing online services like personal shopping assistance, emergency home repair grants and home maintenance assistance,
