REPORT DOUBLE PARKING AND BLOCKED BIKE AND BUS LANES

New York City Department of Transportation announced a new web platform where New Yorkers can report problem areas where double-parking and blocked bike and bus lanes commonly occur due to vehicle loading and unloading. Public feedback gathered via the platform will help NYC DOT identify potential locations to site dedicated loading zones. Double-parking and blocked bike and bus lanes create safety hazards for all road users and contribute to traffic congestion.

Unclaimed Prevailing Wages

Are you employed in any of the following areas?

- Construction work on New York City public work projects such as streets, parks, public schools, subway stations, etc.
- Street excavations by utilities such as Con Edison or National Grid.
- Building service work such as janitor or doorperson in City office buildings or residential apartment buildings receiving certain property tax exemption benefits.
- Food services or temporary office services at City agencies.

If so, you may qualify for prevailing wage: A wage and benefit rate set annually by the New York City Comptroller for each trade or

occupation for employers performing the above-described work. Prevailing wage rates are significantly higher than minimum wage and are published at www.comptroller.nyc.gov/wages.

NEWS AND UPDATES FROM CONGRESSMAN DAN GOLDMAN

Congressman Dan Goldman is pleased to share the following information with the community:

- Congressman Goldman joined Congresswoman Meng in introducing the Hot Foods Act to expand access Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). This expansion will participants to purchase hot foods such as prepared rotisserie chicken, hot sandwiches, and soups. Currently, SNAP limits eligible purchases to foods for take-home preparation and consumption or cold prepared foods. Congressman Goldman also joined U.S. Senator Bernie Sanders and Congresswoman Ilhan Omar in introducing the Universal School Meals Program Act. This legislation would provide free breakfast, lunch, and dinner to every student, expanding on the success of the universal free lunch programs implemented during the COVID-19 pandemic and bringing long-term relief to millions of food-insecure families.
- Congressman Goldman joined Congresswoman Rosa DeLauro and U.S. Senators Bernie Sanders and Patty Murray in introducing the Healthy Families Act to establish a federal paid sick days policy. The Healthy Families Act would allow workers to earn up to 7 job-protected paid sick days per year, establish a simple method for calculating accrued sick time, and allow employers to utilize existing policies on paid sick leave as long as they meet the minimum number of days allowed.

Also, Rental Assistance in Federal FY 24 Budget – Congressman Goldman joined Congresswoman Maxine Waters (CA-43) and Congresswoman Ayanna Pressley (MA-07) in leading a group of 90 members of Congress to call for funding that would provide crucial rental assistance to help ensure affordable housing for low-income households. With the end of the Emergency

Rental Assistance Program, renters continue to face barriers to housing stability in the face of rising rental costs, inflation, and the end of COVID federal and local eviction protections. Goldman, Waters, and Pressley led their colleagues in requesting full funding for Public Housing, Section 8, Section 202, and Section 811 rental assistance programs, including housing choice vouchers and the Public Housing Operating Fund. The members have also requested an additional \$1 billion in funding to create and support new affordable housing units.

Passport Backlog – The U.S. Passport Agency is facing a huge surge in passport applications as many Americans resume international travel and work to replace passports that expired over the last few years. This flood of applications has created a backlog, and processing times are increasing. This has also increased the demand for in-person appointments at passport agencies, making it very difficult to secure one. If you have travel scheduled in Fall or Winter 2023, please apply for your passport renewal now. Current processing times are 7-9 weeks for expedited processing and 10-13 weeks for routine service. This means you should count on being without a passport for 3-4 months, as you will have to mail in your old passport with your renewal application. Passport applications already increase during the summer months so it is likely processing times will continue to increase. You can find the current processing times and everything you need to know about submitting a passport application or renewal


