Municipal Services Update

The Department of Sanitation cleanliness rating of our streets, better known as the "scorecard" rating, was 86.3 for clean streets and 96.5% for sidewalks for the month of May.

We continue to urge everyone to adhere to the Dept. of Sanitation's residential enforcement routing times of 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. and 6 p.m to 7

p.m. daily. Please clean in front of your properties and 18 inches into the gutter area of the street. All sweepings must be bagged and disposed of properly. Thank you for your assistance in helping to keep the District clean.

Also, remember the new Waste Setout Times for setting out trash, recycling, and curbside composting is effect.

Residential buildings have three options:

- Place trash out after 6:00 p.m. in a container with a secure lid,
- Place trash out after 8:00 p.m. if putting bags directly on the curb,
- If a building has nine or more residential units, the property owner may opt into a 4:00–7:00 a.m. set-out window instead. For more information, visit www.nyc.gov/multiunitsetout.

Businesses that place the waste at the curb for collection have two options, unless waste is collected from a loading dock:

- If using a container with a secure lid, place the waste at the curb 1 hour before closing,
- If putting bags directly on the curb, place waste out after 8:00 p.m. Bundled cardboard may go next to the containers or bags

For both residential properties and businesses, setting out too early could result in fines of \$50 for a first offense, \$100 for a second offense, and \$200 for third and subsequent offenses within a 12-month period.

The grace period is ending soon, tickets will be issued, and the first areas to be checked for enforcement will be those places where warnings were issued.

WATER BILL AMNESTY

The NYC Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has extended the one-time amnesty with up to 100% interest forgiveness for all delinquent customers until May 31st. Sadly, thousands of property owners across the city still have not signed up for the amnesty program and are at risk of having both their water shut off for back payments, and a lien placed on the property.

The amnesty program offers a 1:1 reduction in interest fees to the amount of your back bill that is paid. For instance, if you pay 30% of the balance, 30% of interest and fees will be removed from your balance. If you pay off your entire principal balance, 100% of interest and fees will be removed.

ELECTRIC MICRO-MOBILITY EVENT

New York City is one of the most congested cities in the U.S, mainly due to the hustle and bustle of our cars and trucks, but from 2020-2021, sales of electric micromobility devices increased by 240%, mainly driven by the pandemic. Electric micromobility devices provided a more affordable and cleaner alternative to the traditional modes of transportation. More people are now using these

devices for work, traveling, leisure, and as an aid for New Yorkers with disabilities; our city can proactively re-imagine street infrastructure and safety needs while incentivizing this environmentally friendly technology to create a more equitable and safer New York for all.

On Wednesday, May 17th, join the Office of the various agencies, Public Advocate, city advocates, and community organizations for an educational advocacy session on battery safety and storage, proper bike usage, new generation bike lanes, protected charging and storage stations, battery trade-in/buy-back programs, accessibility concerns, and more. WARNING: COMBAT CATALYTIC CONVERTER THEFT

Catalytic converter theft is on the rise, and the NYPD has created the Cat-Scan Program which etches a unique serial number and scannable QR Code onto the catalytic converter and enrolls it in the CatGuard Database. This serial number allows police to identify the vehicle the catalytic converter belongs to. The visible ID number can deter thieves. There will be a Cat-Scan event on Friday, May 19, 2023 from Noon to 4 p.m. at the Upper Parking Lot in Cunningham Park (entrance on Francis Lewis Blvd) in Queens to assist vehicle owners in safeguarding their vehicles and wallets from theft.

BROOKLYN URBAN GARDENER

The Brooklyn Urban Gardener (BUG) certificate program is an annual multiple-session course that covers the basics in urban gardening and community greening. It connects the educational resources of Brooklyn Botanic Garden to the greening efforts of Brooklyn's communities.

BUG students can expect an experiential, trainthe-trainer program. NEWS AND UPDATES FROM CONGRESSMAN DAN GOLDMAN

Rental Assistance in Federal FY 24 Budget – Congressman Goldman joined Congresswoman Maxine Waters (CA-43) and Congresswoman

Ayanna Pressley (MA-07) in leading a group of 90 members of Congress to call for funding that would provide crucial rental assistance to help ensure affordable housing for low-income households. With the end of the Emergency Rental Assistance Program, renters continue to face barriers to housing stability in the face of rising rental costs, inflation, and the end of COVID federal and local eviction protections. Goldman, Waters, and Pressley led their colleagues in requesting full funding for Public Housing, Section 8, Section 202, and Section 811 rental assistance programs, including housing choice vouchers and the Public Housing Operating Fund. The members have also requested an additional \$1 billion in funding to create and support new affordable housing units.

Passport Backlog - The U.S. Passport Agency is facing a huge surge in passport applications as many Americans resume international travel and work to replace passports that expired over the last few years. This flood of applications has created a backlog, and processing times are increasing. This has also increased the demand for in-person appointments at passport agencies, making it very difficult to secure one. If you have travel scheduled in Fall or Winter 2023, please apply for your passport renewal now. Current processing times are 7-9 weeks for expedited processing and 10-13 weeks for routine service. This means you should count on being without a passport for 3-4 months, as you will have to mail in your old passport with your renewal application. Passport applications already increase during the summer months so it is likely processing times will continue to increase. You can find the current processing times and everything you need to know about submitting a passport application or renewal


HIGH SCHOOL ENRICHMENT PAID INTERNSHIP PROGRAM
