The Lincoln Terrace Park Comfort Station (Tennis Court location) construction is underway! This project will demolish the existing field house and construct a new public restroom building in Lincoln Terrace Park. This project should be completed by 2025.

REPLACEMENT OF DISTRIBUTION WATER MAIN IN VARIOUS LOCATIONS

Water distribution mains will be replaced in the following locations as part of Project ID RED395AC:

- Sterling Place between Bedford and Nostrand Avenues
- St. John's Place between Bedford and Nostrand Avenues
- Rogers Avenue between Park and St. John's Places

Construction completion is anticipated in Summer 2024.

HEAT SEASON

Heat season is in effect from now until May 31, 2024. The Department of Housing, Preservation, and Development has strict minimum heat guidelines that all landlords must follow. Between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m., if the outside temperature falls below 55 degrees, the inside temperature is required to be at least 68 degrees Fahrenheit. Between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. if the temperature outside falls below 40 degrees, the inside temperature is required to be at least 55 degrees Fahrenheit. Residents are encouraged to report the lack of heat and hot water to HPD via 311 immediately.

# **Municipal Services Update**

The overall change year-to-date is **2.92**.

The Department of Sanitation cleanliness rating of our streets, better known as the "scorecard" rating, was 98.1% for clean streets and 97.3% for sidewalks for the month of September.

We continue to urge everyone to adhere to the Dept. of Sanitation's residential enforcement routing times of 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. daily. Please clean in front of your properties and 18 inches into the gutter area of the street. All sweepings must be bagged and disposed of properly. Thank you for your assistance in helping to keep the District clean.

Snow Season is here! BK8 garage is gearing up for snow and have identified Section 82 as the night section with Section 81 as the backup. This means that the area of Flatbush Avenue to Bedford Avenue, or Section 81, will have their garbage collected between 8 PM and midnight. The area between Bedford Avenue and Troy Avenue, or Section 82, have the potential to have their trash collected between midnight and 8 AM. Please keep in mind, however, that due to equipment constraints, there are more opportunities for the full District to have their trash collected on night route.

As a reminder, recycling collection is mostly completed on nights in all three sections. All residents are encouraged to set their refuse/recycling out before midnight to ensure that it is collected.

## **CURBSIDE COMPOSTING**

~~~~

Curbside composting, or organics collection, went into effect on October 2, 2023. What does this mean for you? Firstly, it means that Leaf and yard waste separation from trash is now mandatory with a warning period for 3 months from the start of service. Leaf and yard waste must be either neatly corded and bundled, or set out on recycling day in clear plastic or paper leaf bags only. Any other color bag can result in a summons. Leaf Bags are available at the CB8 office.

Secondly, it means that food scraps and foodsoiled paper separation is in place, but as of right now, this separation is voluntary. It will become mandatory once curbside composting expands to all five boroughs. Compost, or organics, must be set out only in covered bins. It cannot be placed in bags or unlidded containers. If you have a brown bin, great! If you want to use your own bin, you may do so as long as it is 55 gallons or less and has a hinge lid. You can mix your leaf and yard waste in your organics bin with your food scraps, but food scraps cannot go into a clear plastic bag with your leaf and yard waste.

Do you need a DSNY brown bin? You can order one for FREE until October 13, 2023.

## **NEW PARKING METER RATES**

All vehicle owners should be aware that the NYC Department of Transportation (DOT) will be **increasing parking meter rates citywide** for both passenger and commercial spaces starting **October 16, 2023**. Date of implementation of rate increases will vary by borough, with Manhattan receiving the first increase and the last increase going into effect on Staten Island at the end of November.

LOCAL LAW 97: DECARBONIZATION

Last month the NYC's Department of Buildings (DOB) released the much awaited second set of rules to help building owners comply with Local Law 97 of 2019, New York City's landmark climate legislation to decarbonize NYC's building sector — the largest source of citywide emissions. The Climate Works for All coalition released an initial statement on these proposed rules expressing concerns over DOB's leniency and possible loopholes and continues to work on detailed comments.


