All women, insured or uninsured, can receive a mammogram. If you have health insurance, your co-pay and deductible will be waived. If you do not have health insurance, you will still be provided a mammogram at no cost to you. Eligibility is simply that you are a NYC resident between the ages of 40 and 79 and have not had a mammogram in the last twelve months.

NEIGHBORHOOD ADVISORY BOARD

Neighborhood Advisory Boards (NAB) provide residents of low-income communities with an opportunity to help the NYC Dept. of Youth and Community Development (DYCD) identify funding priorities.

NABs serve Neighborhood Development Areas (NDAs), which are low-income neighborhoods designated as needing community development support. NAB members are responsible for helping to identify the needs of their local communities. DYCD takes their findings into consideration when allocating federal Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) funding.

Each NDA is represented by a 7 to 12 member Board (NAB) with the authority to help identify community priorities and recommend specific programs. Six members may be selected by DYCD, and six members may be nominated by elected public officials. Members are currently needed for the NAB of District 8. To qualify for membership, you must be full-time residents of the NDA they represent; have lived in the neighborhood for a minimum of six months; be at least 16 years of age; and have no formal associations with any organization that receives DYCD funding under the CSBG program.

On Thursday, September 29, 2022 from 6:30PM to 8:00 PM, there will be a Public Hearing on Federal Funding for Community Social Services for Low – Income Individuals and Families in our neighborhood. The public hearing will be held in person at Crown Heights Apartments located at 1055 St. John's Place, Brooklyn.

# THE CERT TEAM IS LOOKING FOR VOLUNTEERS!

New York City Community Emergency Response Team (NYC CERT) members are dedicated volunteers who undergo a training program that provides basic response skills needed for fire safety, light search and rescue, community disaster support, disaster medical operations, and traffic control. The volunteer commitment is for at least one year of service following graduation.

NYC CERT members participate in community preparedness and support first responders during disaster response activities, including:

- Traffic and crowd control at the planned and unplanned events.
- Escorting New York City residents of evacuated buildings to retrieve personal belongings.
- Missing person searches.
- Staffing assistance centers and interpreting for New Yorkers affected by emergencies.
- Emergency food and supply distribution during power outages and water main breaks.
- Presenting Ready New York preparedness information to communities and build community disaster networks.

SEPTEMBER IS NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS MONTH

National Preparedness Month serves as a reminder to take action to prepare, now and throughout the year, for the types of emergencies that could affect us where we live, work, learn, and worship. With all of the challenges New Yorkers have faced, the 2022 theme is "A Lasting Legacy: The life you've built is worth protecting. Prepare for disasters to create a lasting legacy for you and your family."

Use the National Preparedness Month Messaging Toolkit to coordinate messaging for your community, house of worship or organization. Share the weekly themes, graphics, and links on your social media channels and with your contacts to spread the message of preparedness.

Leave a lasting legacy – prepare for emergencies today! Check out www.NYC.gov/npm for events, preparedness guides, and more.

The best way to ensure your lasting legacy is to prepare your family, and your community for emergencies.

Week 1: Make A Plan - Talk to your friends and family about how to communicate before, during and after emergencies. Utilize the Ready NY My Emergency Plan Guide: www.NYC.gov/myemergencyplan.

Week 2: Gather Supplies - Ensure your lasting legacy for yourself and your family by gathering emergency supplies that can help you whether you stay or go.

Week 3: Plan for Hazards - Prepare to protect yourself and your family by planning for hazards that may affect you and your community. Prepare for Coastal Storms and Floods - Make sure you know your ZONE. Use the Hurricane Evacuation Zone Finder or call 311. Have the right Flood Insurance to protect your home. The NYS Office of Cannabis Management (OCM) recently announced that Conditional Adult-Use Retail Dispensary (CAURD) Licenses are now open, and that the period will close on **September 26, 2022.** Information for CAURD licenses as well as the application can be found

How are Community Boards involved in the process? At least 30 days or no more than two hundred seventy days before filing an application for an adult-use retail dispensary or on-site consumption license, an applicant must notify the municipality of the applicant's intent to apply for such license. For New York City, these notices will come to the local community board, much like on-premise liquor license applications.

IRS-Certified VITA/TCE Volunteer Preparers will provide free tax preparation to New York City residents in-person until October 15, 2022 at the Grow Brooklyn Tax Prep Hub located at 275 Flatbush Avenue Extension Brooklyn. Tax preparation will occur every Tuesday through Thursday from Noon to 5 PM and 6 to 8 PM and Saturday from Noon to 6 PM.

Contactless drop-off is available as well by appointment. Even though it is summer, you can still file your 2021 taxes if you have filed an extension. Additionally, they can assist you with federal tax corrections for this and prior years. Access the 2021 Child Tax Credit and stimulus checks, respond to IRS letters, and apply for or renew ITINs.

Now in its third cycle, the NYC Women's Fund for Media, Music and Theatre ("Women's Fund"), administered by the New York Foundation for the Arts (NYFA) in partnership with the City of New York Mayor's Office of Media and Entertainment (MOME), is part of a groundbreaking series of initiatives that

address the underrepresentation of women in film, music, television and theatre.

In 2021/22 cycle, the Women's Fund will distribute \$2.5M in funding to Media, Music and Theatre projects in NYC.

FINANCIAL HELP FOR CUSTOMERS

In response to the Covid-19 pandemic, the NYS Dept. of Public Service Commission has approved the Electric and Gas Bill Relief Program for income-eligible New Yorkers.

Residential customers who receive qualifying government assistance will receive a bill credit for any past-due balance for service through May 1, 2022. All customers are responsible for bills for service after May 1. To qualify for a bill credit, you must first be enrolled in Con Edison's Energy Affordability Program by December 31, 2022 or have received benefits under NYS's Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) or the Home Energy Assistance Program-Regular Arrears Supplement (RAS).

If you are enrolled in Con Edison's Energy Affordability program or received ERAP or RAS benefits, your bill credit will be processed automatically, and you do not need to take any action. In addition, your service will not be suspended for non-payment while your bill credit is being processed.

You should be enrolled automatically if you received benefits from a qualifying government assistance program such as SNAP or SSI. If you are not enrolled in the Energy

Affordability Program, but qualify, you can sign up online through www.coned.com/myaccount.

They will help you find doctors and specialists in your area of need, accompany you to appointments, assist with medication management, and help you apply for any benefits.

Mental health treatment is offered in their offices via individual and group therapy and psychiatric evaluation. If you are a NYC resident with a diagnosis or are experiencing emotional health concerns and are over the age of 18, IDCC-Crown Heights can assist you free of charge.

## HURRICANE IDA SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING PROGRAM

NYC Mayor's Office of Housing Recovery Operations has extended the deadline to apply for recovery funds in the aftermath of Hurricane Ida that slammed New York City with flash floods on August 26, 2021. The new deadline is **October 3, 2022.**

If you own a one-to-four family home that was uninhabitable because of damage from Ida, applied for FEMA or were not eligible for FEMA assistance because you are a landlord, and have either been denied or received less than the amount needed to complete necessary repairs to make your home habitable, then you may be eligible for up to \$72,000 to cover the cost of repairs and mitigate against future damage.

## **BLACK HOMEOWNERSHIP PROJECT**

The Black Homeownership Project (BHP) was born from the need to identify systematic barriers to Black homeownership in New York City while developing actionable strategies to support Black families in our communities.

Black homeownership has significantly declined in New York City since the 2008 financial crisis, and continues to worsen due to the coronavirus pandemic. BHP is deeply rooted in a community approach, through listening, learning, and bridging the knowledge gap between the needs of homeowners and landlords, their public-sector advocates (including non-profits partners), and policy leaders at the local, state, and federal level.

BHP has developed five pilot program ideas to improve Black homeownership in New York City at a systems level. The pilots are Down payment Assistance Navigator; Savings Accelerator; Generation 2 Generation Estate Planning; Homeowner Landlord Services; and Pathways to Tenant Purchase.

The BHP project can only be successful with input and expertise from the community organizations, agencies, community boards, homeowners, and residents of New York City.
