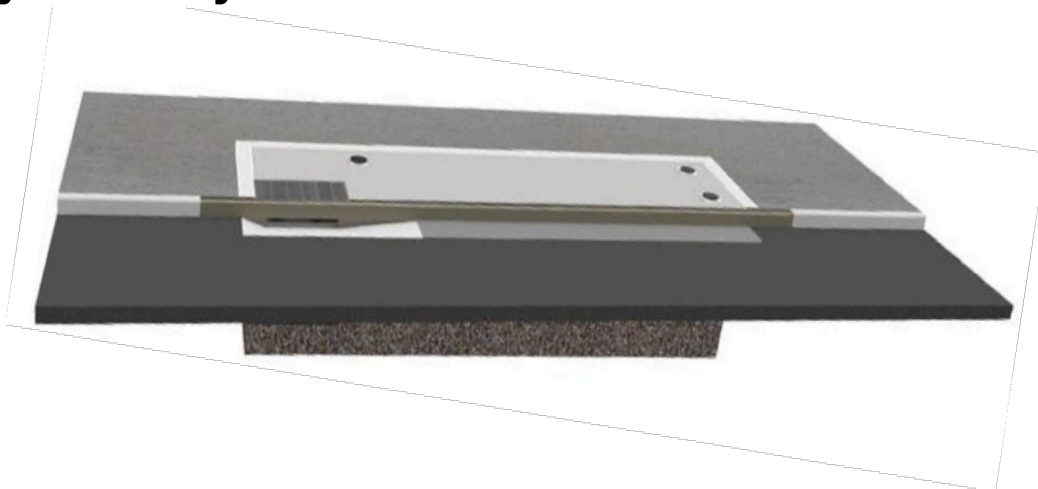

## GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE IN BROOKLYN COMMENCES

- St. Andrews Place between Herkimer Street and Atlantic Avenue
- Atlantic Avenue between Kingston Avenue and Albany Avenue
- Pacific Street between New York Avenue and Kingston Avenue
- Dean Street between New York Avenue and Kingston Avenue
- Bergen Street between New York Avenue and Brooklyn Avenue
- St. Marks Avenue between Brooklyn Avenue and Kingston Avenue
- Prospect Place between Rogers Avenue and Brooklyn Avenue

Please be advised, beginning on/about Monday, May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2020, the New York City Department of Design and Construction (NYCDDC) anticipates starting a multi-location reconstruction project. Beginning with setting up Maintenance and Protection of Traffic, followed by the Mobilization of Materials. This project entails the installation of a type of Green Infrastructure, known as Infiltration Basins. These concrete basins will be integrated into the sidewalk. They will allow stormwater to be absorbed into the ground instead of flowing into local streets throughout Brooklyn, weather and field conditions permitting. The permitted work hours will be Monday through Friday from 07:00 AM to 04:00 PM.

## What are the Community Impacts?

- The DDC is committed to maintaining a work site that is safe and clean. However, dust, noise and heavy equipment are common elements of construction and we ask for your patience during the project.
- There may be limited street access on certain blocks. However, deliveries to commercial/residential properties and emergency vehicle access will be allowed. In addition, the DDC will be baiting the construction zone on a regular basis to control rodent populations.

## Some Things to Remember:

- Please follow all posted DOT rules and regulations during non-construction hours. Emergency vehicle and Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.
- **Driveway/Loading dock access** – may be temporarily restricted.
- **Vehicular access** – may be restricted on certain streets in certain locations.

## Public Transportation

- **Bus Relocation** – where and when necessary, buses may be detoured in/around the work zones.

## Pedestrian/Traffic

- **Pedestrian access** – to buildings will be maintained at all times.
- **Parking** – will be temporarily restricted so construction may proceed. Signs will be posted where necessary.

## Water Service Interruptions

- Temporary water service disruptions may be necessary. If it is necessary for DDC to turn off your water service, you will receive advance written notification 72 hours before the service interruption.

## Special Needs

- Individuals with special needs who may be uniquely impacted by this project should contact the project's Community Construction Liaison, as soon as possible, to make them aware of your situation. The DDC will work with you to attempt to minimize the inconvenience as much as possible.
