City Carrier Assistants (CCAs)

- CCAs are alternates for regular letter carriers who deliver and collect mail on foot or by vehicle in varying weather conditions. A position that works both indoors and outdoors in all weather, CCAs often log 10 miles or more a day between walking and driving.

Tractor Trailer Operators (TTOs)

- Tractor Trailer Operators connect Post Office™ locations by delivering packages from one postal facility to another. All deliveries are local; this is not a long-haul position. Drivers will need a Class A CDL license and can expect to work in all weather, both indoors and outdoors.

Postal Support Employee (PSE) Sales & Services

- PSE Sales and Services employees know everything about USPS® products and services. Customer service and a great attitude are helpful for this job as these are often the employees who sort mail or serve as the employees at the customer service window.



PSE Mail Processing Clerks

- PSE Mail Processing Clerks work in a fast-paced environment at all times. They sort mail by hand or machine and work mostly at night. Millions of mailpieces are processed on a daily basis, so this job is good for someone who likes to stay busy.

Mail Handler Assistants (MHAs)

- MHAs are on their feet most of their shift—moving mail containers from point A to point B, loading trucks and belts, pushing, lifting, labeling and scanning. This is the most physically demanding position in Mail Processing.

Rural Carrier Associates (RCAs)

- RCAs are versatile, helping deliver mail to rural customers, selling stamps and other products, and helping out wherever they can. This is a position that is often referred to as the Post Office On Wheels. This job includes driving and takes place in all weather, both indoors and outdoors.

Assistant Rural Carriers (ARCs)

- ARCs primarily load and deliver packages on Sundays and observed holidays. They may provide full delivery assistance on Saturdays. This job includes driving and work is performed indoors and outdoors in all types of weather.
